

Application for 2023 MITIE Research Fellowship

About the Institute

The [Minnesota Institute for Trauma-Informed Education](#) (MITIE) was launched in May 2021 as a partnership of the University of St. Thomas School of Education and Morrison Family College of Health, with generous funding from the Carolyn Foundation and Sauer Family Foundation.

Founded with a mission to develop, support, and advance the field of trauma-informed and trauma-engaged education, the Institute seeks to provide an arena for scholars, practitioners, and researchers to convene and learn about the latest practices in trauma-informed education across K-12 and higher education.

The Institute has four main goals:

- Establish a sustainable model for trauma-informed and trauma-engaged education
- Conduct trainings, workshops, webinars, conferences, and seminars to expand the knowledge basis of trauma-informed education
- Create a pipeline of teachers, social workers, and professionals who are knowledgeable about trauma-informed and trauma-engaged education
- Increase the number of schools that adopt trauma-informed approaches

Purpose of Fellowship

Research Fellowship with MITIE provides opportunities for interested professionals to complete a year-long research project in trauma-informed education. The one-year Fellowship is designed to support further advancement in understanding of the impacts of trauma and toxic stress on the educational enterprise at the level of the individual student, classroom, teacher, administration, or society at large. Innovative, creative, and courageous inquiries into these topics are welcome.

Research Fellows will be invited into a national community of interested and experienced individuals dedicated to addressing critical issues in K-12 and higher education today.

Potential Fellows & Projects

Eligible applicants include practitioners, scholars, and health professionals in the education field who submit a proposal for a delineated project that can be accomplished within twelve consecutive months on a topic related to trauma-informed practices in education.

Research projects could include (but are not limited to):

1. Review of literature and production of a manuscript;
2. Review, evaluation, and compilation of key trauma-informed education research, frameworks, models, case studies, or resources for implementation;

3. Design of new interventions in schools and classrooms;
4. Assessment of toxic stress and health variables in samples of students;
5. Revision of curricula according to trauma-informed practices;
6. Research on specific needs, challenges, or approaches for addressing student trauma within cultural or historically underserved student populations; or
7. Development of evaluation instruments or processes to establish fidelity of trauma-informed practices.

Each potential Fellow must be associated with or sponsored by an established institution such as a school, district, college or university, or health or nonprofit organization. All projects involving the study of subjects must be approved by the Fellow's Institutional Review Board (IRB).

Supervision

Fellows will receive project supervision on a monthly basis, or as needed, for the extent of their fellowship year from a trauma expert, education/administrative leader, or mentor scholar—as is most appropriate to the specific project's goals and needs. Fellows will also participate in a regular seminar on trauma-informed education and be invited to attend bi-monthly MITIE Think Tank meetings in conversation with MITIE leadership and MITIE Senior Fellows.

Award

Each project will be supported with a \$12,000 stipend award paid on a quarterly basis. If a team of individuals (of no more than three persons) proposes to collaborate on a single research project and their project is selected, each team member will be named a Research Fellow and the \$12,000 stipend award will be split equally between project members.
